- Fit to work 10–12-hour days in field construction environment
- Successful completion of applicable safety certifications (training will be provided by employer)

- Prior environmental, archaeological, pipeline, or general construction experience or environmental training preferred, but not essential
- Knowledge of traditional land and resource use and/or cultural heritage interests an asset

- Some evening and weekend work will be required
- Wage \$20 - \$25 per hour depending on qualifications
