LANDS DEPARTMENT

LAW ENGAGEMENT

With all of the new housing being built, Shuswap Band has drafted a Residential Tenancy Law similar to what other municipalities use. This not only protects the landlord but also the renter in cases of eviction and disputes.

A Culture and Heritage Law has also been drafted to regulate and protect culturally significant sites and objects on Reserve. Among other cultural heritage rights, it recognizes the rights of indigenous peoples to protect, maintain, and have access to their cultural sites; use and control of ceremonial objects; maintain, protect, and control their intellectual properties; and repatriate their human remains as well as levy fines etc. The current Heritage Conservation act in BC protects all heritage sites except federal lands ie: Reserves, which means we have no way to protect sites or discipline developers who disturb sites on our land.

The Unsightly Premises Law was drafted after hearing from the community about lands that are in a constant state of disrepair and are displeasing to the eye. This law will protect the peace, quiet, restful enjoyment, comfort and convenience of Shuswap Band Members and other persons on Shuswap Band lands.

These laws HAVE NOT yet been passed. Shuswap Band will be holding community engagement sessions soon, to hear your comments concerns and answer any questions.





Grade 2 and 3 students visit Shuswap Band!

On Thursday, June 2nd Grade 2 and 3 students from Ms. Whittick's Windermere Elementary School class visited the Shuswap Band Office and Health Centre. The class was welcomed by Chief Cote as well as Suzie Thomas, Youth & Community Coordinator, and Chenoa Paccagnan, Education Coordinator.

The class had previously met and learned from three local wildlife biologists that specialize in the topics of fish, water, and habitat research. They had also been learning about the Indigenous perspective of how the water is a teacher from District Vice-Principal, Jenna Jasek. After having learned about salmon, their life cycles, habitats, and importance to our local Indigenous peoples, the students were moved to write letters to the Shuswap Band asking how they can help to "bring the salmon back."



HOW TO KEEP EVERYONE UPDATED AND SAFE DURING AN EMERGENCY SITUATION

Voyent Alert is a means to keep the SIB family aware of local events and disruptions that can help reduce day-to-day stress.

It can notify you about issues that impact where you live, such as:

- An accident that is causing severe traffic backups along a route.
- A critical and potentially life-threatening incident occurs, such as when a fire breaks out close to your home.
- A major disaster occurs that requires evacuation of your current location.


Registration is completely free, easy to do and is completely anonymous. You won't need to worry about usernames, passwords or the protection of your personal data.

Voyent Alert is a method used to give you the ability to choose how you want to receive time sensitive information through your Home Phone, Cell Phone, Text Message, Email or you can register for all or just one of them.


FOOT CARE

NALOXONE KITS & HARM REDUCTION SUPPLIES

Naloxone kits including nasal kits can be picked up for free at your local pharmacy or at Shuswap's health department. We also have harm reduction supplies for anyone in need. Staff will support you with your needs in a confidential and safe manner.

- Naloxone kits (nasal and needle) training available upon request.
- Fentanyl testing strips (training available upon request)
- Harm reduction supplies (sterile needles, sharps bins, sterile cookers with filters, safer sex supplies, straight and bubble pipes, etc.)
