#### Message from Chief & Council:

**Weyt-kp Membership!** We hope you've all have had a good month since our last newsletter. It looks like March is bringing springtime to us at last. The Band has been busy over the past month, with Finance and reporting on the many projects on the go. Chief and Council are very pleased to see the financial position we're in as a Band and look forward to increasing opportunities for our membership.

Some current Forestry issues include FCRSA negotiations; the Golden Community forest initiative and request for tenure from BC; Louisiana Pacific's tenure transfer to Pacific Wood Tech and relationship with the Band; Shuswap Band Pilot Project initiative to harvest in a new and sustainable manner; and ongoing search for opportunity in Secwepemcul'ecw.

The Shuswap Band team is planning another Ceremonial Salmon Release for May. We are hoping to see more community members at the event than we were able to during last year's release. We are organizing the event over the next few months. Environmental conditions will dictate the exact timing, so stay tuned for a mid-May announcement.

Columbia River Treaty (CRT) negotiations are ramping up, and the issues negotiated are becoming more detailed. Staying on top of these issues is of utmost importance to us as Secwepemc Peoples to address our losses and mitigate ongoing impacts. The Interim Revenue Sharing Agreement is near complete and will see a payment to SNTC for a significant amount. We need to collaborate with other Secwepemc on the target of these resources. This payment will occur annually and is expected to increase. Other impacts currently being negotiated are Governance, Redress and Salmon. These issues will be negotiated this year, with Salmon being a continuance until restoration is achieved, far past CRT negotiations.

Columbia River Salmon Recovery Initiative (CRSRI) has recently held an Executive Working Group meeting where the 5 Governments passed decisions on the CRSRI department's reporting. Also passed was the budget for the next fiscal. This budget is twice of last year's, and signifies a change in momentum for CRSRI in the way of on-the-ground work.

There have been many community consultation sessions over the past few weeks that have been very well attended by our membership. We are very grateful to all of you for your attendance and input into these meetings. It has been wonderful to see our Elders sharing their knowledge and our youth learning and participating in these discussions. This shows our strong presence in the Columbia Basin, and will help build a positive, true history for future generations. Kukstsemc to all!

Thank you to everyone who attended the Band meeting last month! It is always a pleasure to share the progressive work that Council and staff are completing to support and build up our community. We hope all students, staff, and parents had a wonderful fun spring break. It seems once Spring Break is over, summer holidays come quickly.

#### Wills and Estates

We have received funding for this fiscal year to continue our Estates Management Program. In addition to Wills this year, we will also offer Power of Attorney (A **power of attorney** is a legal document that gives another person the power to take care of your financial and legal matters for you) and Personal Representation Agreements (A Representation Agreement is the only way you can appoint someone to assist you or to act on your behalf for health care and personal care matters. It can also cover routine financial affairs). If you or your family hold CP Land and have unsettled estate issues, please make an appointment, to discuss your options. **We can now pay for members living off reserve.**

#### WILLS & ESTATES INFORMATION

#### FUNDING for the 2023/2024 YEAR IS HERE AND AVAILABLE FOR ALL MEMBERS ON AND OFF RESERVE (VIA ZOOM).

#### **DO YOU HAVE A WILL?**

Less than 9% of First Nation peoples on reserve pass away with a will. How wills and estates of First Nations individuals are handled depends on whether they lived off-reserve or on-reserve.



#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- The Indigenous Services Canada website has information about planning your estate.
- Your Will differs if you live on- or off-reserve.
- The Indian Act outlines what should be included in your will.
- You can't gift your land on reserve to someone who is not a member of your First Nation.
- You can change your Will as often as you like.
- Writing a Will doesn't have to be complicated or costly.

#### WHY MAKE A WILL?

- To provide for your loved ones, your children, and grandchildren.
- To clearly state who should receive your possessions.
- To leave instructions for end-of-life ceremonies.
- To decide who will get your home.
- To name who will take care of your children and dependents.
- To name who will take care of your estate.

#### A VALID WILL UNDER THE INDIAN ACT



The formal requirements for the Will of an indigenous person who lived on-reserve does not have to conform to provincial Succession Law Reform Acts; rather, under section 45(2) of the Indian Act, a Will is valid as long as it:

- Is in writing
- Is signed by the person whose Will it is (called the testator), and
- Indicates the wishes of the testator with respect to how their property should be dispersed or disposed of.

Wills and Estates portfolios including questions, concerns, ruling, appeals and enforcement still fall under the Indian Act.
