NOTICE: First Nations Drinking Water Settlement DEADLINE HAS BEEN EXTENTED TO MARCH 7, 2024

If you lived on reserve during the below dates and lived in any of the areas linked to the water system below, you may be entitled to compensation.

Please call reception at 250.341.3678 to make an appointment to receive help with submitting your claim.

Eligibility:

- People born before November 20, 1995 can only claim for advisory years after 2013:
 - People born after November 20, 1995 can claim for all advisory years;
- People who passed away after November 20, 2017 can be compensated through a claim by their estate representatives;
- People who passed away before November 20, 2017 cannot be compensated.

Estate claims and representative claims for minors have their own forms that can be found on the website or at the band office.

DOCTOR CLINIC



NALOXONE KITS & HARM REDUCTION SUPPLIES

Naloxone kits including nasal kits can be picked up for free at your local pharmacy or at Shuswap's health department. We also have harm reduction supplies for anyone in need. Staff will support you with your needs in a confidential and safe manner.

- Naloxone kits (nasal and needle) training available upon request.
- Fentanyl testing strips (training available upon request)
- Harm reduction supplies (sterile needles, sharps bins, sterile cookers with filters, safer sex supplies, straight and bubble pipes, etc.)



Recovery for addiction, mental health, and trauma online

Online Intensive Outpatient Programs (IOPs) from EHN Canada enable recovery from a variety of struggles, without an inpatient stay.

Developed by EHN Canada's nationwide team of experts, our IOPs offer a variety of tools and methods to support a successful recovery. This includes weekly group therapy sessions, individual therapy, and a corresponding app that provides 24/7 access to progress tracking, coping mechanisms and more.

- Workplace Trauma and Operational Stress Injury


Stephanie Miller Administrative Assistant

ECCC- Wilmer prescribed burn.


Tuesday, March 7th 4-6 PM

Saves Lives




You can access harm reduction supplies from the Shuswap Health Team!

The Shuswap Indian Band is currently undertaking an Integrated Community Housing Plan and we would like to hear from our members!

WHY DO A HOUSING PLAN?

In undertaking this Plan, the Nation is hoping to:

- Assess and identify the housing needs of the community, both in the near and long-term;
- Identify areas for future community housing;
- Engage community members on their preferred housing locations and types;
- Review funding opportunities available to the Nation to meet their desired housing targets for immediate and future needs:
- Assess and identify labour and resource capacity to complete the work; and
- Identify development opportunities and constraints, including infrastructure considerations.

WHAT HAS BEEN COMPLETED TO DATE?

This work is being undertaken through funding from the New Approach to Housing Stream: Governance and Capacity program, and the Nation has engaged the consulting firm Urban Systems to assist in developing the Plan.

Work completed to date includes:

- Compilation of background information and relevant background data;
- Lands assessment;
- Infrastructure assessment;
- Geotechnical analysis at Lot 30/Village Site; and
- Development opportunities and constraints analysis.

Through this work the Project Team has identified two (2) preliminary locations in which the Nation may pursue future community housing. These locations have been presented to Chief and Council and we would now like to engage community members.

These sites are presented on the following pages.

SITE 1: LOT 30/VILLAGE SITE


The Nation is currently exploring expanding housing at the Lot 30/Village Site. This includes the creation of 14 additional lots on the bench below (north) of the current development, as well as a re-alignment of the existing parcel configuration. The Conceptual lot layout is presented below.

SITE 2: LOT 12-3-3 (WESTROC ROAD)

Lot 12-3-3, located between Westroc Road and Highway 93/95, has been identified as the potential location for a new community housing subdivision. The conceptual Plan below illustrates a potential two-phased approach, with Phase 1 including 19 lots and Phase 2 including 13 Lots. It should be noted that this lot layout is conceptual only and subject to change.
